Any woman not less than eighteen years of age, who is descended from a man or woman who gave unflinching loyal service to the cause of American Independence as a recognized patriot, soldier, sailor, or civil officer, in one of the several Colonies or States, or of the United Colonies or States, is eligible to membership in the National Society, Daughters of the American Revolution; *provided* she is personally acceptable.

Official proof of service must be furnished with the application; also references to authorities quoted, to show line of descent. *Where reference is made to unpublished or inaccessible records, the applicant must file duplicate certified copies of same.* Statements based upon tradition alone cannot be considered.

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

Aurherst Colt enlisted April 19th, 1777, was discharged eight months after.

Capt. Wheeler's Co., Col. Chapman's regiment 1778
August 3rd discharged Sept 12, 1779

"From Aug. 3, 1777 was at headquarters, was quartermaster, sergeant, surgeon. Discharged Jan 1, 1778 was on board a River Sloop as surgeon mate under Dr. Noyes. July 7, 1779 Received orders from Col. Trumbull to raise guard and take command of Post at mouth of Connecticut River."
