F. L. HOLCOMBE.

FAYETTEVILLE — Frank Lanman Holcombe, Cumberland County dairyman, died Friday night at 8:10 o'clock in a local hospital after a two day illness. Funeral services will be held Sunday at 5 p. m. from the First Presbyterian Church by Dr. Walker B. Healy. Burial will be in Cross Creek Cemetery. Widely known as a State dairy expert, Mr. Holcombe was operating the Cottonade Farm off Bragg Boulevard at the time of his death. He was in charge of Dairy Month in Cumberland during May. He was born September 29, 1885, in Hartford, Conn., son of the late Amherst Lanman Holcombe and Clara Frances Babbitt Holcombe. His family moved to Southern Pines in 1897, and Mr. Holcombe moved to Fayetteville in the fall of 1911. He was a graduate of Iowa State College and was married to the former Inez Hollowell of Dow City, Iowa, in 1914. He was Past President of the North Carolina Holstein-Friesian Association, director of the North Carolina Milk Producers Association and director of the North Carolina Dairy Foundation. Active in State Farm Bureau work, he also was an elder in the First Presbyterian Church. Surviving in addition to his wife are two sons, Lt. Col. James H. Holcombe, serving overseas with the Army, Harold Holcombe of Asheboro; a daughter, Mrs. Tom Struthers of Sanford; one sister, Mrs. J. Talbot Johnson, Aberdeen.
