- A-8-1-6-5-1-1-Drayton Holcomb became a peddler at age 14 years, selling from his wagon, -principally clocks, -made in Conn. and soon visited many States, selling in Southern States in winter and, in Northern States in Summer; enlisted July 1814 at Granby, Hartford Co., Conn. in U.S. Army and was stationed at New London, New London Co., Conn., Conn. and vicinity and was in Staunton, Conn. when it was bombarded by the British. He served until Jan. 1915 when he was honorably discharged. For this service he signed two applications for U.S. pension, the first, Feb. 23, 1877 at Pelham, Welland Co., Ont., Can., stating his age then as 81 years; the 2nd at Vernon, Trumbull Co., O. at age 86 years, he then being a widower. Ralsamon Clark and Silas Phelps both of Vernon were his character witnesses. His brother, Grove Catlin Holcomb II in Lafayette Co., Wis. signed Dec. 5, 1872 proof of Drayton's military service in 1814 at age 18 years; of his discharge as above and removal from Granby, Conn. to N.Y. State and later to Canada, where he stayed further stating that Drayton's officers were Capt. Abner Case, Maj. Isaac Phelps and Gen. Lusk of the Regt. and that Drayton was in one battle. Soon after marriage Drayton abandoned peddling ; invested his earnings in dairy cattle and operated a small dairy for 2 years
